MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI

May 5, 2011

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri, met to conduct a regular meeting on Thursday, May 5, 2011, at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall. The following were present: Mayor Penny Lyons, Alderman Lois Farmer, Alderman Dave Gasper, Alderman Steve Kahrs, Alderman John Olivarri, Alderman Kevin Rucker and Alderman Ron Schmitt. City Clerk Diann Warner was present and performed the duties of that office.

Mayor's Communications. Mayor Lyons reported that she attended the first Mayor's breakfast sponsored by the Missouri Municipal League in Jefferson City last Thursday. Mayor Franzeskos from Lake Ozark and Mayor Holland from Eldon also attended. It was a good opportunity for networking with other cities and compare how the economy is affecting our cities. The keynote speaker was Peter Harkness who is the founder and publisher of the Congressional Quarterly News Service in Washington. Mayor Lyons said Mr. Harkness compared historical trends with current trends. The breakfast was well attended and should become an annual event.

Citizens Communications.

Mayor Lyons announced that the applicant for Rezoning Case No. 357 has requested the application be returned to the Planning Commission.

Mr. David Plotke, 3860 Port Lane, was present to question Rezoning Case No. 357. Mayor Lyons explained that the applicant has requested that this case not be considered at this time. City Attorney Ed Rucker said there will be an amended application before the Planning Commission. Mayor Lyons announced that notification would be sent to surrounding property owners as before.

Alderman Gasper seconded the motion which was voted on and unanimously passed.

Unfinished Business.

Bill No. 11-20. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT WITH THE OSAGE BEACH FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT (OBFPD) AND MEMORIALIZES THE FIRE DISTRICT'S RIGHTS UNDER SECTION 99.847 RSMo. CONCERNING EMERGENCY SERVICE DISTRICTS AND THE REVENUES THEY RECEIVE FOR PROVIDING SERVICES IN THE TIF AREAS.

City Attorney Ed Rucker explained that Bill No. 11-20 authorizes the City to enter into an agreement with the Osage Beach Fire Protection District (OBFPD) and memorializes the fire district's rights under section 99.847 RSMo concerning emergency service districts and the revenues they receive for providing services in TIF areas. Pursuant to this agreement the OBFPD will receive 50% of the payment in lieu of taxes received by the City attributable to the fire districts' real property tax in the TIF project area.

Mayor Lyons presented the first reading of Bill No. 11-20 by title only. It was noted that Bill No. 11-20 has been available for public review.

Alderman Kahrs moved to approve the first reading of Bill No. 11-20 as presented. Alderman Gasper seconded the motion. The following roll call vote was taken: "Ayes:" Alderman Kahrs, Alderman Rucker, Alderman Gasper, Alderman Schmitt, Alderman Olivarri, Alderman Farmer. "Nays": None. The first reading of Bill No. 11-20 was passed and approved.

Mayor Lyons presented the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-20 by title only.

Alderman Rucker announced that he co-authored this specific statute and he questioned whether there had been court cases on this issue. Mr. David Bushek responded that there had been some disputes between cities and fire districts and the solution is to have both parties agree to the terms through a written agreement.

Alderman Kahrs moved to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-20 as presented. Alderman Rucker seconded the motion. The following roll call vote was taken to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-20 and to pass same into Ordinance: "Ayes": Alderman

Rucker, Alderman Gasper, Alderman Schmitt, Alderman Olivarri, Alderman Farmer, Alderman Kahrs. "Nays": None. Bill No. 11-20 was passed and approved as Ordinance No. 11.20.

Bill No. 11-26. AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TAX INCREMENT REVENUE NOTES (DIERBERGS OSAGE BEACH PROJECT), SERIES 2011, OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO FINANCE CERTAIN REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT COSTS RELATING TO THE AMENDED DIERBERGS OSAGE BEACH TAX INCREMENT FINANCING REDEVELOPMENT PLAN AND PROJECT; AND APPROVING CERTAIN DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF THE NOTES.

City Attorney Ed Rucker explained that the TIF agreement anticipates the City to issue notes in the amount of \$3 million and \$2.1 million. He said Bill No. 11-26 authorizes the issuance of notes but it does not change the pay as you go terms.

Mayor Lyons presented the first reading of Bill No. 11-26 by title only. It was noted that Bill No. 11-26 has been available for public review.

Alderman Farmer moved to approve the first reading of Bill No. 11-26 as presented. Alderman Gasper seconded the motion. The following roll call vote was taken: "Ayes": Alderman Gasper, Alderman Schmitt, Alderman Farmer, Alderman Kahrs, Alderman Rucker. "Nays": Alderman Olivarri. The first reading of Bill No. 11-26 was passed and approved.

Mayor Lyons presented the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-26 by title only.

Alderman Farmer moved to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-26 as presented. Alderman Kahrs seconded the motion. The following roll call vote was taken to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-26 and to pass same into Ordinance: "Ayes": Alderman Schmitt, Alderman Farmer, Alderman Kahrs, Alderman Rucker, Alderman Gasper. "Nays": Alderman Olivarri. Bill No. 11-26 was passed and approved as Ordinance No. 11.26.

New Business.

Public Hearing. Rezoning Case No. 357. Terry Ross Requests to Rezone Property from A-1 General Agriculture to R-3 Multi-family and R-1a.

Mayor Lyons announced that Terry Ross, the applicant, has asked that the application be sent back to the Planning Commission because he desired to amend the application. Alderman Rucker questioned whether the Planning Commission would have a new public hearing. City Planner Cary Patterson explained that the applicant wants to amend the application however it is the Board's decision to send it back to the Planning Commission. Sending the application back to the Planning Commission does not affect the application negatively or favorably.

Public Hearing. Lazy Days Condominium Homeowners Association Voluntary Annexation.

The Lazy Days Condominium Homeowners are requesting annexation of a portion of their development that is out at the very point of the corridor and is left out of the City limits as the legal

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description follows a quarter section line in that area. The subject area contains a portion of three of the buildings within the development. The City may resolve this issue by incorporating the requested annexation property if it is determined to be reasonable and necessary for the proper growth of the community.

No action is necessary at this time. If no objections are received within fourteen days following the public hearing, the Board may consider completing the annexation.

Robert Patula representing the homeowners association spoke in favor of the voluntary annexation. There are 2 ½ buildings they would like to have annexed.

There being no further comments, Mayor Lyons closed the public hearing at 6:50 p.m.

Bill No. 11-28. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING ORDINANCE 10.75 ADOPTING THE 2011 ANNUAL BUDGET, TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS FOR NECESSARY EXPENSES.

The new account is to fund the ramp at Nichols Road. Some of the self-restricted funds for the Hatchery Road Project are planned to be used plus the \$100,000 that the Osage Beach Special Road District is contributing to the City for the project.

The agreement for the 4th ramp was approved at the April 21st Board of Aldermen meeting. The Engineering Department recommended approval of Bill 11-28.

Alderman Rucker asked that the minutes reflect that \$195,456 will come from self restricted funds for the Hatchery Road Project.

Mayor Lyons presented the first reading of Bill No. 11-28 by title only. It was noted that Bill No. 11-28 has been available for public review.

Alderman Farmer moved to approve the first reading of Bill No. 11-28 as presented. Alderman Gasper seconded the motion which was voted on and passed unanimously passed. (See Alderman Schmitt's comment in his report under Communications from Board Members.)

Mayor Lyons presented the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-28 by title only.

Alderman Farmer moved to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-28 as presented. Alderman Gasper seconded the motion. The following roll call vote was taken to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-28 and to pass same into Ordinance: "Ayes": Alderman Olivarri, Alderman Farmer, Alderman Kahrs, Alderman Rucker, Alderman Gasper. "Nays": None. "Abstain": Alderman Schmitt. Bill No. 11-28 was passed and approved as Ordinance No. 11.28.

Bill 11-29. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, ADOPTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI.

Alderman Olivarri moved to return Rezoning Case No. 357 to the Planning Commission. Alderman Rucker seconded the motion which was voted on and unanimously passed.

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Bill No. 11-30. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, ESTABLISHING THE LOCATION OF A STOP SIGN AS INDICATED HEREIN.

City Engineer Nick Edelman explained that MoDOT is in the process of completing the connection for residents that live north of the expressway on Laguna Beach. Residents will be using Sycamore Valley Drive in the near future to access Highway 54. A stop sign is planned to be installed at the intersection of Sycamore Valley and Laguna Beach Road.

The Engineering Department recommended approval of Bill No. 11-30.

Mayor Lyons presented the first reading of Bill No. 11-30 by title only. It was noted that Bill No. 11-30 has been available for public review.

Alderman Kahrs moved to approve the first reading of Bill No. 11-30 as presented. Alderman Schmitt seconded the motion which was voted on and unanimously passed.

Mayor Lyons presented the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-30 by title only.

Alderman Kahrs moved to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-30 as presented. Alderman Schmitt seconded the motion. The following roll call vote was taken to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-30 and to pass same into Ordinance: "Ayes": Alderman Farmer, Alderman Kahrs, Alderman Rucker, Alderman Gasper, Alderman Schmitt, Alderman Olivarri. "Nays": None. Bill No. 11-30 was passed and approved as Ordinance No. 11.30.

Bill No. 11-31. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING SECTION II, STOP SIGNS, BY DELETING THE STOP SIGNS LOCATED AT LINKS ROAD AT OSAGE BEACH PARKWAY, ZEBRA ROAD AT STEWART DRIVE, AND ZEBRA ROAD AT OSAGE BEACH PARKWAY, AND ADDING STOP SIGNS AT THE SOUTHERLY INTERSECTION OF ZEBRA ROAD AND OSAGE BEACH PARKWAY; AT THE NORTHERLY INTERSECTION OF ZEBRA ROAD AND OSAGE BEACH PARKWAY, LINKS ROAD HEADING EAST AT ZEBRA ROAD, LINKS ROAD HEADING WEST AT ZEBRA ROAD, AND STEWART DRIVE AT ZEBRA ROAD.

City Engineer Nick Edelman explained that Zebra Road and Stewart Drive Reconstruction Project is nearing completion and since Zebra is currently connected to Links Road, the plan is to rename Links to Zebra. There is still a Links Road but it does not currently connect to Osage Beach Parkway. The other stops signs are installed as a result of the road reconstruction project.

The Engineering Department recommended approval of Bill No. 11-31.

Mayor Lyons presented the first reading of Bill No. 11-31 by title only. It was noted that Bill No. 11-31 has been available for public review.

Alderman Olivarri moved to approve the first reading of Bill No. 11-31 as presented. Alderman Rucker seconded the motion which was voted on and unanimously passed.

Mayor Lyons presented the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-31 by title only. It was noted that Bill No. 11-31 has been available for public review.

UNAPPROVED

Alderman Farmer moved to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-31 as presented. Alderman Kahrs seconded the motion. The following roll call vote was taken to approve the second and final reading of Bill No. 11-31 and to pass same into Ordinance: “Ayes”: Alderman Kahrs, Alderman Rucker, Alderman Gasper, Alderman Schmitt, Alderman Farmer, Alderman Olivarri. “Nays”: None. Bill No. 11-31 was passed and approved as Ordinance No. 11.31.

Communications from Board Members.

Alderman Kahrs. Steve Kahrs reported that the contractor came across Nichols Road today and they were professional and completed the work quickly. He thanked City Engineer Nick Edelman for the guard rails installed on Case Road.

Alderman Rucker. Kevin Rucker questioned the status of widening the entrance to Beach Drive. City Engineer Nick Edelman will speak with a MoDot representative for an update, however MoDot will be doing some work on the curb and gutter and it is possible they will widen the entrance to Beach Drive at that time.

Alderman Kahrs said that he has observed damage on the overpass on Jeffries and it appears that the one on Case is having the same problem. City Engineer Edelman said he has spoken to the inspectors and they will do some patch work on those areas.

Alderman Schmitt. Alderman Schmitt asked that the record reflect that he should have abstained during the voice vote for the first reading of Bill No. 11-28. Alderman Schmitt abstained when called on the roll call vote for the second reading of Bill No. 11-28.

Alderman Schmitt reported that the individual who spoke to the Board a few weeks ago about the high cost of reconnection fees had an accident in Arkansas and both legs were broken. Also, the individual’s house burned a few weeks ago. Alderman Schmitt presented some interesting historical facts.

Alderman Farmer. Lois Farmer questioned the status of the guard rails on Case Road. Alderman Kahrs said the guard rails have been installed. Alderman Farmer thanked the City for the plant sent to her husband during his recent hospitalization.

Staff Communications.

City Planner. Cary Patterson reported that Rezoning Case No. 357 would be sent back to the Planning Commission for their review on June 14, 2011.

Park Department. Brian Willey reported on activity in the Park Department;

City Engineer. Nick Edelman reported that MoDot made an announcement this week on eliminating positions and office closings.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m.





AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, REPEALING CHAPTER 415, FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION IN ITS ENTIRETY AND A NEW CHAPTER 415 FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE IS HEREBY ENACTED IN ITS PLACE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Chapter 415, Flood Damage Prevention, be repealed in its entirety and a new Chapter 415, Floodplain Management Ordinance, is hereby enacted in its place to read as follows:

ARTICLE I. STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION, FINDINGS OF FACT AND PURPOSES

SECTION 415.010. STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION

The Legislature of the State of Missouri has in RSMO 79.110 delegated the responsibility to local governmental units to adopt floodplain management regulations designed to protect the health, safety, and general welfare. Therefore, the City of Osage Beach, Missouri ordains as follows:

SECTION 415.020. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. *Flood Losses Resulting from Periodic Inundation*

The special flood hazard areas of City of Osage Beach, Missouri are subject to inundation which results in loss of life and property, health and safety hazards, disruption of commerce and governmental services, extraordinary public expenditures for flood protection and relief, and impairment of the tax base; all of which adversely affect the public health, safety and general welfare.

2. *General Causes of the Flood Losses*

These flood losses are caused by (1) the cumulative effect of development in any delineated floodplain causing increases in flood heights and velocities; and (2) the occupancy of flood hazard areas by uses vulnerable to floods, hazardous to others, inadequately elevated, or otherwise unprotected from flood damages.

3. *Methods Used To Analyze Flood Hazards*

The Flood Insurance Study (FIS) that is the basis of this ordinance uses a standard engineering method of analyzing flood hazards which consist of a series of interrelated steps.

- a. Selection of a base flood that is based upon engineering calculations which permit a consideration of such flood factors as its expected frequency of occurrence, the area inundated, and the depth of inundation. The base flood selected for this ordinance is representative of large floods which are characteristic of what can be expected to occur on the particular streams subject to this ordinance. It is the general order of a flood which could be expected to have a one percent chance of occurrence in any one year as delineated on the Federal Insurance Administrator's FIS, and illustrative materials for Camden County dated June 16, 2011 as amended, and any future revisions thereto.
- b. Calculation of water surface profiles is based on a standard hydraulic engineering analysis of the capacity of the stream channel and overbank areas to convey the regulatory flood. [Article 1, Section C]

SECTION 415.030. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

It is the purpose of this ordinance to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare; to minimize those losses described in Article 1, Section B (1); to establish or maintain the community's eligibility for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) as defined in 44 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 59.22(a) (3); and to meet the requirements of 44 CFR 60.3(c) by applying the provisions of this ordinance to:

1. Restrict or prohibit uses that are dangerous to health, safety, or property in times of flooding or cause undue increases in flood heights or velocities;
2. Require uses vulnerable to floods, including public facilities that serve such uses, be provided with flood protection at the time of initial construction; and
3. Protect individuals from buying lands that are unsuited for the intended development purposes due to the flood hazard.

ARTICLE II. DEFINITIONS

SECTION 415.040. DEFINITIONS

Unless specifically defined below, words or phrases used in this ordinance shall be interpreted so as to give them the same meaning they have in common usage and to give this ordinance its most reasonable application.

"100-year Flood" see *"base flood."*

"Accessory Structure" means the same as *"appurtenant structure."*

"Actuarial Rates" see *"risk premium rates."*

"Administrator" means the Federal Insurance Administrator.

"Agency" means the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

"Agricultural Commodities" means agricultural products and livestock.

"Agricultural Structure" means any structure used exclusively in connection with the production, harvesting, storage, drying, or raising of agricultural commodities.

"Appeal" means a request for review of the Floodplain Administrator's interpretation of any provision of this ordinance or a request for a variance.

"Appurtenant Structure" means a structure that is on the same parcel of property as the principle structure to be insured and the use of which is incidental to the use of the principal structure.

"Area of Special Flood Hazard" is the land in the floodplain within a community subject to a one percent or greater chance of flooding in any given year.

"Base Flood" means the flood having a one percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.

"Basement" means any area of the structure having its floor subgrade (below ground level) on all sides.

"Building" see *"structure."*

"Chief Executive Officer" or "Chief Elected Official" means the official of the community who is charged with the authority to implement and administer laws, ordinances, and regulations for that community.

"Community" means any State or area or political subdivision thereof, which has authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for the areas within its jurisdiction.

"Development" means any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, levees, levee systems, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations, or storage of equipment or materials.

"Elevated Building" means for insurance purposes, a non-basement building which has its lowest elevated floor raised above ground level by foundation walls, shear walls, posts, piers, pilings, or columns.

"Eligible Community" or "Participating Community" means a community for which the Administrator has authorized the sale of flood insurance under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

"Existing Construction" means for the purposes of determining rates, structures for which the *"start of construction"* commenced before the effective date of the FIRM or before January 1, 1975, for FIRMs effective before that date. *"Existing construction"* may also be referred to as *"existing structures."*

"Existing Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision" means a manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including, at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed before the effective date of the floodplain management regulations adopted by a community.

"Expansion to an Existing Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision" means the preparation of additional sites by the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads).

"Flood" or "Flooding" means a general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas from (1) the overflow of inland and/or (2) the unusual and rapid accumulation or runoff of surface waters from any source.

"Flood Elevation Determination" means a determination by the Administrator of the water surface elevations of the base flood, that is, the flood level that has a one percent or greater chance of occurrence in any given year.

"Flood Elevation Study" means an examination, evaluation and determination of flood hazards.

"Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM)" means an official map of a community, on which the Administrator has delineated both the special flood hazard areas and the risk premium zones applicable to the community.

"Flood Insurance Study (FIS)" means an examination, evaluation and determination of flood hazards and, if appropriate, corresponding water surface elevations.

"Floodplain" or "Flood-prone Area" means any land area susceptible to being inundated by water from any source (*see "flooding"*).

"Floodplain Management" means the operation of an overall program of corrective and preventive measures for reducing flood damage, including but not limited to emergency preparedness plans, flood control works, and floodplain management regulations.

"Floodplain Management Regulations" means zoning ordinances, subdivision regulations, building codes, health regulations, special purpose ordinances (such as floodplain and grading ordinances) and other applications of police power. The term describes such state or local regulations, in any combination thereof that provide standards for the purpose of flood damage prevention and reduction.

"Floodproofing" means any combination of structural and nonstructural additions, changes, or adjustments to structures that reduce or eliminate flood damage to real estate or improved real property, water and sanitary facilities, or structures and their contents.

"Floodway" or "Regulatory Floodway" means the channel of a river or other watercourse and the adjacent land areas that must be reserved in order to discharge the base flood without cumulatively increasing the water surface elevation more than one foot.

"Freeboard" means a factor of safety usually expressed in feet above a flood level for purposes of floodplain management. *"Freeboard"* tends to compensate for the many unknown factors that could contribute to flood heights greater than the height calculated for a selected size flood and floodway, as determined from data available from other sources, conditions, such as bridge openings and the hydrological effect of urbanization of the watershed.

"Functionally Dependent Use" means a use that cannot perform its intended purpose unless it is located or carried out in close proximity to water. This term includes only docking facilities and facilities that are necessary for the loading and unloading of cargo or passengers, but does not include long-term storage or related manufacturing facilities.

"Highest Adjacent Grade" means the highest natural elevation of the ground surface prior to construction next to the proposed walls of a structure.

"Historic Structure" means any structure that is (a) listed individually in the National Register of Historic Places (a listing maintained by the Department of Interior) or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as meeting the requirements for individual listing on the National Register; (b) certified or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as contributing to the historical significance of a registered historic district or a district preliminarily determined by the Secretary to qualify as a registered historic district; (c) individually listed on a state inventory of historic places in states with historic preservation programs which have been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; or (d) individually listed on a local inventory of historic places in communities with historic preservation programs that have been certified either (1) by an approved state program as determined by the Secretary of the Interior or (2) directly by the Secretary of the Interior in states without approved programs.

"Lowest Floor" means the lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area, including basement. An unfinished or flood-resistant enclosure, usable solely for parking of vehicles, building access, or storage, in an area other than a basement area, is not considered a building's lowest floor, **provided** that such enclosure is not built so as to render the structure in violation of the applicable floodproofing design requirements of this ordinance.

"Manufactured Home" means a structure, transportable in one or more sections, that is built on a permanent chassis and is designed for use with or without a permanent foundation when attached to the required utilities. The term *"manufactured home"* does not include a *"recreational vehicle."*

"Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision" means a parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale.

"Map" means the Flood Hazard Boundary Map (FHBM), Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), or the Flood Boundary and Floodway Map (FBFM) for a community issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

"Market Value" or "Fair Market Value" means an estimate of what is fair, economic, just and equitable value under normal local market conditions.

"Mean Sea Level" means, for purposes of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929 or other datum, to which base flood elevations shown on a community's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) are referenced.

"New Construction" means, for the purposes of determining insurance rates, structures for which the *"start of construction"* commenced on or after the effective date of an initial FIRM or after December 31, 1974, whichever is later, and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures. For floodplain management purposes, *"new construction"* means structures for which the *"start of construction"* commenced on or after the

effective date of the floodplain management regulations adopted by a community and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures.

"New Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision" means a manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lot on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed on or after the effective date of floodplain management regulations adopted by the community.

"(NFIP)" means the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

"Participating Community" also known as an *"eligible community,"* means a community in which the Administrator has authorized the sale of flood insurance.

"Person" includes any individual or group of individuals, corporation, partnership, association, or any other entity, including Federal, State, and local governments and agencies.

"Principally Above Ground" means that at least 51 percent of the actual cash value of the structure, less land value, is above ground.

"Recreational Vehicle" means a vehicle which is (a) built on a single chassis; (b) 400 square feet or less when measured at the largest horizontal projections; (c) designed to be self-propelled or permanently towable by a light-duty truck; and (d) designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use.

"Remedy A Violation" means to bring the structure or other development into compliance with Federal, State, or local floodplain management regulations; or, if this is not possible, to reduce the impacts of its noncompliance.

"Repetitive Loss" means flood-related damages sustained by a structure on two separate occasions during a 10-year period for which the cost of repairs at the time of each such flood event, equals or exceeds twenty-five percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

"Risk Premium Rates" means those rates established by the Administrator pursuant to individual community studies and investigations which are undertaken to provide flood insurance in accordance with Section 1307 of the National Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 and the accepted actuarial principles. *"Risk premium rates"* include provisions for operating costs and allowances.

"Special Flood Hazard Area" see *"area of special flood hazard."*

"Special Hazard Area" means an area having special flood hazards and shown on an FHBM, FIRM or FBFM as zones (unnumbered or numbered) A or AE.

"Start of Construction" includes substantial-improvements, and means the date the building permit was issued provided the actual start of construction, repair, reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition placement, or other improvements were within 180 days of the permit date. The *actual start* means either the first placement of permanent construction of a structure on a site, such as the pouring of slabs or footings, the installation of piles, the construction of columns, any work beyond the stage of excavation, or the placement of a manufactured home on a foundation.

Permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading and filling, the installation of streets and/or walkways, excavation for a basement, footings, piers, foundations, the erection of temporary forms, nor installation on the property of accessory structures, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or not part of the main structure. For a substantial-improvement, the *actual start of construction* means the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of a building, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the building.

"State Coordinating Agency" means that agency of the state government, or other office designated by the governor of the state or by state statute at the request of the Administrator to assist in the implementation of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) in that state.

"Structure" means, for floodplain management purposes, a walled and roofed building, including a gas or liquid storage tank, that is principally above ground, as well as a manufactured home. *"Structure"* for insurance purposes, means a walled and roofed building, other than a gas or liquid storage tank that is principally above ground and affixed to a permanent site, as well as a manufactured home on a permanent foundation. For the latter purpose, the term includes a building while in the course of construction, alteration or repair, but does not include building materials or supplies intended for use in such construction, alteration or repair, unless such materials or supplies are within an enclosed building on the premises.

"Substantial-Damage" means damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to it's before damaged condition would equal or exceed 50 percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred. The term includes Repetitive Loss buildings (see definition).

For the purposes of this definition, "repair" is considered to occur when the first repair or reconstruction of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of the building commences.

The term does not apply to:

- a.) Any project for improvement of a building required to comply with existing health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which have been identified by the Code Enforcement Official and which are solely necessary to assure safe living conditions, or
- b.) Any alteration of a "historic structure" provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a "historic structure", or
- c.) Any improvement to a building.

"Substantial Improvement" means any combination of reconstruction, alteration, or improvement to a building, taking place during the life of the building, in which the cumulative percentage of improvement equals or exceeds fifty percent of the current market value of the building. For the purposes of this definition, an improvement occurs when the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of the building commences, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the building. This term includes structures, which have incurred "repetitive loss" or "substantial damage", regardless of the actual repair work done.

The term does not apply to:

- a.) any project for improvement of a building required to comply with existing health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which have been identified by the Code Enforcement Official and which are solely necessary to assure safe living conditions, or
- b.) Any alteration of a "historic structure" provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a "historic structure." Or
- c.) Any building that has been damaged from any source or is categorized as repetitive loss.

** Recommend development of written and adopted policy and procedure.

Substantially improved existing manufactured home parks or subdivisions is where the repair, reconstruction, rehabilitation or improvement of the streets, utilities and pads equals or exceeds 50 percent of the value of the streets, utilities and pads before the repair, reconstruction or improvement commenced.

"Temporary Structure" means a structure permitted in a district for a period not to exceed 180 days and is

required to be removed upon the expiration of the permit period. Temporary structures may include recreational vehicles, temporary construction offices, or temporary business facilities used until permanent facilities can be constructed, but at no time shall it include manufactured homes used as residence.

"Variance" means a grant of relief by the community from the terms of a floodplain management regulation. Flood insurance requirements remain in place for any varied use or structure and cannot be varied by the community.

"Violation" means the failure of a structure or other development to be fully compliant with the community's floodplain management regulations. A structure or other development without the elevation certificate, other certifications, or other evidence of compliance required by this ordinance is presumed to be in violation until such time as that documentation is provided.

"Water Surface Elevation" means the height, in relation to the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929 (or other datum where specified) of floods of various magnitudes and frequencies in the floodplain.

ARTICLE III. GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 415.050. LANDS TO WHICH ORDINANCE APPLIES

This ordinance shall apply to all lands within the jurisdiction of the City of Osage Beach identified as unnumbered and numbered A zones and AE Zones on the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) for Camden County dated June 16, 2011 on maps panels 29029C0115C, 29029C0120C, 29029C0140C, 29029C0230C, and 29029C0235C as amended, and any future revisions thereto. In all areas covered by this ordinance, no development shall be permitted except through the issuance of a floodplain development permit, granted by the Board of Aldermen or its duly designated representative under such safeguards and restrictions as the Board of Aldermen or the designated representative may reasonably impose for the promotion and maintenance of the general welfare, health of the inhabitants of the community, and as specifically noted in Article 4.

SECTION 415.060. FLOODPLAIN ADMINISTRATOR

The City Engineer is hereby designated as the Floodplain Administrator under this ordinance.

SECTION 415.070. COMPLIANCE

No development located within the special flood hazard areas of this community shall be located, extended, converted, or structurally altered without full compliance with the terms of this ordinance and other applicable regulations.

SECTION 415.080. ABROGATION AND GREATER RESTRICTIONS

It is not intended by this ordinance to repeal, abrogate, or impair any existing easements, covenants, or deed restrictions. However, where this ordinance imposes greater restrictions, the provisions of this ordinance shall prevail. All other ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency only.

SECTION 415.090. INTERPRETATION

In their interpretation and application, the provisions of this ordinance shall be held to be minimum requirements, shall be liberally construed in favor of the governing body, and shall not be deemed a limitation or repeal of any other powers granted by State statutes.

SECTION 415.100. WARNING AND DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

The degree of flood protection required by this ordinance is considered reasonable for regulatory purposes and is based on engineering and scientific methods of study. Larger floods may occur on rare occasions or the flood heights may be increased by man-made or natural causes, such as ice jams and bridge openings restricted by debris. This ordinance does not imply that areas outside the floodplain or land uses permitted within such areas will be free from flooding or flood damage. This ordinance shall not create a liability on the part of the City of Osage Beach, any officer or employee thereof, for any flood damages that may result from reliance on this ordinance or any administrative decision lawfully made hereunder.

SECTION 415.110. SEVERABILITY

If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of appropriate jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

ARTICLE IV. ADMINISTRATION

SECTION 415.120. FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT PERMIT - REQUIRED

A floodplain development permit shall be required for all proposed construction or other development, including the placement of manufactured homes, in the areas described in Article 2, Section A. No person, firm, corporation, or unit of government shall initiate any development or substantial-improvement or cause the same to be done without first obtaining a separate floodplain development permit for each structure or other development.

SECTION 415.130. DESIGNATION OF FLOODPLAIN ADMINISTRATOR

The City Engineer is hereby appointed to administer and implement the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 415.140. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF FLOODPLAIN ADMINISTRATOR

Duties of the City Engineer shall include, but not be limited to:

1. Review of all applications for floodplain development permits to assure that sites are reasonably safe from flooding and that the floodplain development permit requirements of this ordinance have been satisfied;
2. review of all applications for floodplain development permits for proposed development to assure that all necessary permits have been obtained from Federal, State, or local governmental agencies from which prior approval is required by Federal, State, or local law;
3. Review all subdivision proposals and other proposed new development, including manufactured home parks or subdivisions, to determine whether such proposals will be reasonably safe from flooding;
4. Issue floodplain development permits for all approved applications;
5. Notify adjacent communities and the Missouri State Emergency Management Agency (MO SEMA) prior to any alteration or relocation of a watercourse, and submit evidence of such notification to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA);
6. Assure that the flood carrying capacity is not diminished and shall be maintained within the altered or relocated portion of any watercourse.
7. Verify and maintain a record of the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor, including basement, of all new or substantially improved structures;

8. Verify and maintain a record of the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level) that the new or substantially improved non-residential structures have been floodproofed;
9. When floodproofing techniques are utilized for a particular non-residential structure, the City Engineer shall require certification from a registered professional engineer or architect.

SECTION 415.150. APPLICATION FOR FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT PERMIT

To obtain a floodplain development permit, the applicant shall first file an application in writing on a form furnished for that purpose. Every floodplain development permit application shall:

1. describe the land on which the proposed work is to be done by lot, block and tract, house and street address, or similar description that will readily identify and specifically locate the proposed structure or work;
2. Identify and describe the work to be covered by the floodplain development permit;
3. Indicate the use or occupancy for which the proposed work is intended;
4. Indicate the assessed value of the structure and the fair market value of the improvement;
5. Identify the existing base flood elevation and the elevation of the proposed development;
6. Give such other information as reasonably may be required by the City Engineer;
7. Be accompanied by plans and specifications for proposed construction; and
8. Be signed by the permittee or his authorized agent who may be required to submit evidence to indicate such authority.

ARTICLE V. PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD HAZARD REDUCTION

SECTION 415.160. GENERAL STANDARDS

1. No permit for floodplain development shall be granted for new construction, substantial-improvements, and other improvements, including the placement of manufactured homes, within any unnumbered or numbered A zones and AE zones, unless the conditions of this section are satisfied.
2. All areas identified as unnumbered A zones on the FIRM are subject to inundation of the 100-year flood; however, the base flood elevation is not provided. Development within unnumbered A zones is subject to all provisions of this ordinance. If Flood Insurance Study data is not available, the community shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation or floodway data currently available from Federal, State, or other sources.
3. Until a floodway is designated, no new construction, substantial-improvements, or other development, including fill, shall be permitted within any numbered A zone or AE zone on the FIRM, unless it is demonstrated that the cumulative effect of the proposed development, when combined with all other existing and anticipated development, will not increase the water surface elevation of the base flood more than one foot at any point within the community.
4. All new construction, subdivision proposals, substantial-improvements, prefabricated structures, placement of manufactured homes, and other developments shall require:

- a. Design or adequate anchorage to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure resulting from hydrodynamic and hydrostatic loads, including the effects of buoyancy;
- b. Construction with materials resistant to flood damage;
- c. Utilization of methods and practices that minimize flood damages;
- d. All electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, air-conditioning equipment, and other service facilities be designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding;
- e. New or replacement water supply systems and/or sanitary sewage systems be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and on-site waste disposal systems be located so as to avoid impairment or contamination; and
- f. Subdivision proposals and other proposed new development, including manufactured home parks or subdivisions, located within special flood hazard areas are required to assure that:
 - (1) All such proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage;
 - (2) All public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage;
 - (3) Adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards; and
 - (3) All proposals for development, including proposals for manufactured home parks and subdivisions, greater than five (5) acres or fifty (50) lots, whichever is lesser, include within such proposals base flood elevation data.

5. *Storage, material, and equipment*

- a. The storage or processing of materials within the special flood hazard area that are in time of flooding buoyant, flammable, explosive, or could be injurious to human, animal, or plant life is prohibited.
- b. Storage of other material or equipment may be allowed if not subject to major damage by floods, if firmly anchored to prevent flotation or if readily removable from the area within the time available after a flood warning.

6. *Accessory Structures*

Structures used solely for parking and limited storage purposes, not attached to any other structure on the site, of limited investment value, and not larger than 400 square feet, may be constructed at-grade and wet-flood-proofed provided there is no human habitation or occupancy of the structure; the structure is of single-wall design; a variance has been granted from the standard floodplain management requirements of this ordinance; and a floodplain development permit has been issued.

SECTION 415.170. SPECIFIC STANDARDS

1. In all areas identified as unnumbered and numbered A zones and AE Zones, where base flood elevation data have been provided, as set forth in Article 4, Section A(2), the following provisions are required:

a. *Residential Construction*

New construction or substantial-improvement of any residential structures, including manufactured homes, shall have the lowest floor, including basement, elevated to one (1) foot above base flood level.

b. *Non-Residential Construction*

New construction or substantial-improvement of any commercial, industrial, or other non-residential structures, including manufactured homes, shall have the lowest floor, including basement, elevated to one (1) foot above the base flood level or, together with attendant utility and sanitary facilities, be floodproofed so that below the base flood elevation the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water and with structural components having the capability of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and effects of buoyancy. A registered professional engineer or architect shall certify that the standards of this subsection are satisfied. Such certification shall be provided to the Floodplain Administrator as set forth in Article 3, Section C (9).

c. Require, for all new construction and substantial-improvements that fully enclosed areas below lowest floor used solely for parking of vehicles, building access, or storage in an area other than a basement and that are subject to flooding shall be designed to automatically equalize hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls by allowing for the entry and exit of floodwaters. Designs for meeting this requirement must either be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect or meet or exceed the following minimum criteria:

- (1) A minimum of two openings having a total net area of not less than one square inch for every square foot of enclosed area subject to flooding shall be provided; and
- (2) The bottom of all opening shall be no higher than one foot above grade. Openings may be equipped with screens, louvers, valves, or other coverings or devices provided that they permit the automatic entry and exit of floodwaters.

SECTION 415.180. MANUFACTURED HOMES

1. All manufactured homes to be placed within all unnumbered and numbered A zones and AE zones on the community's FIRM shall be required to be installed using methods and practices that minimize flood damage. For the purposes of this requirement, manufactured homes must be elevated and anchored to resist flotation, collapse, or lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors.
2. Require manufactured homes that are placed or substantially improved within unnumbered or numbered A zones and AE zones on the community's FIRM on sites:
 - a. Outside of a manufactured home park or subdivision;
 - b. In a new manufactured home park or subdivision;
 - c. In an expansion to an existing manufactured home park or subdivision; or
 - d. In an existing manufactured home park or subdivision on which a manufactured home has incurred substantial-damage as the result of a flood,

Be elevated on a permanent foundation such that the lowest floor of the manufactured home is elevated to one (1) foot above the base flood elevation and be securely attached to an adequately anchored foundation system to resist flotation, collapse, and lateral movement.

3. Require that manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved on sites in an existing manufactured home park or subdivision within all unnumbered and numbered A zones and AE zones on the community's FIRM, that are not subject to the provisions of Article 4, Section C(2) of this ordinance, be elevated so that either:
 - a. The lowest floor of the manufactured home is at one (1) foot above the base flood elevation; or
 - b. The manufactured home chassis is supported by reinforced piers or other foundation elements of at least equivalent strength that are no less than thirty-six (36) inches in height above grade and be securely attached to an adequately anchored foundation system to resist flotation, collapse, and lateral movement.

SECTION 415.185. FLOODWAY

If a community determines there are areas of special flood hazard that may be defined as floodway, through the use of base flood elevation and floodway data available from a Federal, State, or other source, including data developed pursuant to Article 4, Section A(4)f(4), and determines this data is suitable as criteria for requiring that new construction, substantial improvements, or other development in Zone A, the community must meet the standards below:

- 1) Adopt a regulatory floodway based on the principle that the area chosen for the regulatory floodway must be designed to carry the waters of the base flood without increasing the water surface elevation of that flood more than one foot at any point.
- 2) Prohibit encroachments, including fill, new construction, substantial-improvements, and other development within the adopted regulatory floodway unless it has been demonstrated through hydrologic and hydraulic analyses performed in accordance with standard engineering practice that the proposed encroachment would not result in any increase in flood levels within the community during the occurrence of the base flood discharge.

SECTION 415.190. RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

1. Require that recreational vehicles placed on sites within all unnumbered and numbered A zones and AE zones on the community's FIRM either:
 - a. be on the site for fewer than 180 consecutive days, or
 - b. be fully licensed and ready for highway use*; or
 - c. Meet the permitting, elevation, and anchoring requirements for manufactured homes of this ordinance.

*A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is on its wheels or jacking system, is attached to the site only by quick-disconnect type utilities and security devices, and has no permanently attached additions.

ARTICLE VI. FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT VARIANCE PROCEDURES

SECTION 415.210. ESTABLISHMENT OF APPEAL BOARD

The Board of Adjustment as established by the City of Osage Beach shall hear and decide appeals and requests for variances from the floodplain management requirements of this ordinance.

SECTION 415.220. RESPONSIBILITY OF APPEAL BOARD

Where an application for a floodplain development permit or request for a variance from the floodplain management regulations is denied by the City Engineer, the applicant may apply for such floodplain development permit or variance directly to the Appeal Board, as defined in Article 5, Section A.

The Board of Adjustment shall hear and decide appeals when it is alleged that there is an error in any requirement, decision, or determination made by the City Engineer in the enforcement or administration of this ordinance.

SECTION 415.230. FURTHER APPEALS

Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Board of Adjustment or any taxpayer may appeal such decision to the Camden County Circuit Court as provided in RSMO 89.110.

SECTION 415.240. FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT VARIANCE CRITERIA

In passing upon such applications for variances, the Board of Adjustment shall consider all technical data and evaluations, all relevant factors, standards specified in other sections of this ordinance, and the following criteria:

1. The danger to life and property due to flood damage;
2. The danger that materials may be swept onto other lands to the injury of others;
3. The susceptibility of the proposed facility and its contents to flood damage and the effect of such damage on the individual owner;
4. The importance of the services provided by the proposed facility to the community;
5. The necessity to the facility of a waterfront location, where applicable;
6. The availability of alternative locations, not subject to flood damage, for the proposed use;
7. The compatibility of the proposed use with existing and anticipated development;
8. The relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan and floodplain management program for that area;
9. The safety of access to the property in times of flood for ordinary and emergency vehicles;
10. The expected heights, velocity, duration, rate of rise and sediment transport of the flood waters, if applicable, expected at the site; and,
11. The costs of providing governmental services during and after flood conditions, including maintenance and repair of public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems; streets; and bridges.

SECTION 415.250. CONDITIONS FOR APPROVING FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT VARIANCES

1. Generally, variances may be issued for new construction and substantial-improvements to be erected on a lot of one-half acre or less in size contiguous to and surrounded by lots with existing structures constructed below the base flood elevation, providing items 2 through 6 below have been fully considered. As the lot size increases beyond the one-half acre, the technical justification required for issuing the variance increases.
2. Variances may be issued for the reconstruction, rehabilitation, or restoration of structures listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the State Inventory of Historic Places, or local inventory of historic places upon determination provided the proposed activity will not preclude the structure's continued historic designation.
3. Variances shall not be issued within any designated floodway if any increase in flood levels during the base flood discharge would result.
4. Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief.
5. Variances shall only be issued upon (a) a showing of good and sufficient cause, (b) a determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship to the applicant, and (c) a determination that the granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public safety, extraordinary public expense, create nuisances, cause fraud on or victimization of the public, or conflict with existing local laws or ordinances.
6. A community shall notify the applicant in writing over the signature of a community official that (1) the issuance of a variance to construct a structure below base flood elevation will result in increased premium rates for flood insurance up to amounts as high as \$25.00 for \$100.00 of insurance coverage and (2) such construction below the base flood elevation increases risks to life and property. Such notification shall be maintained with the record of all variance actions as required by this ordinance.

SECTION 415.260. CONDITIONS FOR APPROVING VARIANCES FOR ACCESSORY STRUCTURES

Any variance granted for an accessory structure shall be decided individually based on a case by case analysis of the building's unique circumstances. Variances granted shall meet the following conditions as well as those criteria and conditions set forth in Article 5, Sections D and E of this ordinance.

In order to minimize flood damages during the 100-year flood and the threat to public health and safety, the following conditions shall be included for any variance issued for accessory structures that are constructed at-grade and wet-floodproofed.

1. Use of the accessory structures must be solely for parking and limited storage purposes in zone A only as identified on the community's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM).
2. For any new or substantially damaged accessory structures, the exterior and interior building components and elements (i.e., foundation, wall framing, exterior and interior finishes, flooring, etc.) below the base flood elevation, must be built with flood-resistant materials in accordance with Article 4, Section A (4)(b) of this ordinance.
3. The accessory structures must be adequately anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure in accordance with Article 4, Section A (4)(a) of this ordinance. All of the building's structural components must be capable of resisting specific flood-related forces including hydrostatic, buoyancy, and hydrodynamic and debris impact forces.
4. Any mechanical, electrical, or other utility equipment must be located above the base flood elevation or floodproofed so that they are contained within a watertight, floodproofed enclosure that is capable of resisting damage during flood conditions in accordance with Article 4, Section A (4)(d) of this ordinance.

5. The accessory structures must meet all National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) opening requirements. The NFIP requires that enclosure or foundation walls, subject to the 100-year flood, contain openings that will permit the automatic entry and exit of floodwaters in accordance with Article 4, Section B (1)(c) of this ordinance.
6. The accessory structures must comply with the floodplain management floodway encroachment provisions of Article 4, Section E of this ordinance. No variances may be issued for accessory structures within any designated floodway, if any increase in flood levels would result during the 100-year flood.
7. Equipment, machinery, or other contents must be protected from any flood damage.
8. No disaster relief assistance under any program administered by any Federal agency shall be paid for any repair or restoration costs of the accessory structures.
9. A community shall notify the applicant in writing over the signature of a community official that (1) the issuance of a variance to construct a structure below base flood elevation will result in increased premium rates for flood insurance up to amounts as high as \$25.00 for \$100.00 of insurance coverage and (2) such construction below the base flood elevation increases risks to life and property. Such notification shall be maintained with the record of all variance actions as required by this ordinance.
10. Wet-floodproofing construction techniques must be reviewed and approved by the community and registered professional engineer or architect prior to the issuance of any floodplain development permit for construction.

SECTION 415.270: CONDITIONS FOR APPROVING VARIANCES FOR TEMPORARY STRUCTURES.

Any variance granted for a temporary structure shall be decided individually based on a case by case analysis of the building's unique circumstances. Variances granted shall meet the following conditions as well as those criteria and conditions set forth in Article 5, Sections D and E of this ordinance.

1. A temporary structure may be considered for location within flood-prone areas only when all of the following criteria are met:
 - a. Use of the temporary structure is unique to the land to be developed and cannot be located outside of the floodplain nor meet the NFIP design standards;
 - b. Denial of the temporary structure permit will create an undue hardship on the property owner;
 - c. The community has adopted up-to-date NFIP and building regulations to direct placement and removal of the temporary structure; and,
 - d. The community has sufficient staff to monitor the placement, use, and removal of the temporary structure throughout the duration of the permit.
2. Once all of the above conditions are met, an application for a special use permit must be made to the City of Osage Beach. The City of Osage Beach shall consider all applications for special use permits for a temporary structure based on the following criteria:
 - a. The placement of any temporary structure within flood-prone areas shall require an approved special use permit. The special use permit shall be valid for a period not to exceed 180 days.
 - b. Special use permits applications, for a temporary structure to be located in flood-prone areas, shall conform to the standard public hearing process prior to any community action on the permit request.

c. An emergency plan for the removal of the temporary structure that includes specific removal criteria and time frames from the agency or firm responsible for providing the manpower, equipment, and the relocation and disconnection of all utilities shall be required as part of the special use permit application for the placement of any temporary structure.

d. On or before the expiration of the end of the 180 day special use permit period, the temporary structure shall be removed from the site. All utilities, including water, sewer, communication, and electrical services shall be disconnected.

e. To ensure the continuous mobility of the temporary structure for the duration of the permit, the temporary structure shall retain its wheels and tires, licenses, and towing appurtenance on the structures at all times.

f. Under emergency flooding conditions, the temporary structure shall be removed immediately or as directed by the community and as specified in the emergency removal plan.

g. Violation of or non-compliance with any of the stated conditions of the special use permit during the term thereof, shall make the permit subject to revocation by resolution of the governing body of the community. Issuance of permit revocation notice shall be made to the landowner, the occupant of the land, and to the general public.

h. Any deviation from the approved site plan shall be deemed a violation of the special use permit approval and the uses allowed shall automatically be revoked. The subsequent use of the land shall be as it was prior to the special permit approval. In event of any violation, all permitted special uses shall be deemed a violation of this ordinance and shall be illegal, non-conforming uses and shall be summarily removed and abated.

i. If the temporary structure is to be returned to its previously occupied site, the process for issuing a special use permit must be repeated in full. Any subsequent permit shall be valid for 180 days only.

ARTICLE VI. VIOLATIONS

SECTION 415.280. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

Violation of the provisions of this ordinance or failure to comply with any of its requirements (including violations of conditions and safeguards established in connection with granting of variances) shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this ordinance or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than \$500.00, and in addition, shall pay all costs and expenses involved in the case. Each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the City of Osage Beach or other appropriate authority from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.

ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENTS

SECTION 415.290. AMENDMENTS

office of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The regulations of this ordinance are in compliance with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) regulations.

Comments and Recommendation of Department:

If the Board decides to permit the private display of consumer fireworks at private residences within the city, this ordinance will create a permit system to regularize and manage the process. Bill 11-35 will also provide notice to the police and fire protection district of such displays within the city.

City Administrator Comments and Recommendation:

As noted above, the City Attorney prepared this ordinance at the request of Alderman Kahrs. No comments or recommendation.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, REPEALING ARTICLE XIV, FIREWORKS OF CHAPTER 210 OFFENSES; SECTIONS 210.680, 210.690, 210.700, 210.710, 210.720, 210.730, 210.740, 210.750 AND NEW SECTIONS 210.680, 210.690, 210.700, 210.710, 210.720, 210.730, 210.740, 210.750 ARE HEREBY ENACTED IN ITS PLACE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Sections 210.680, 210.690, 210.700, 210.710, 210.720, 210.730, 210.740, 210.750, are repealed and new Sections 210.680, 210.690, 210.700, 210.710, 210.720, 210.730, 210.740, 210.750 are hereby enacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE XIV. FIREWORKS

SECTION 210.680: DEFINITION

In this Article "fireworks" means any composition or device for producing a visible, audible, or both visible and audible effect by combustion, deflagration, or detonation and that meets the definition of consumer, proximate, or display fireworks as set forth by 49 CFR Part 171 to end, United States Department of Transportation hazardous materials regulations, and American Pyrotechnics Association 87-1 standards.

SECTION 210.690: EXCEPTIONS

Nothing in this Article shall be construed to prohibit any resident wholesaler, dealer or jobber to sell at wholesale such fireworks as are not herein prohibited, or the sale of any kind of fireworks provided the same are to be shipped directly out of State, or the use of fireworks by railroads or other transportation agencies for signal purposes or illumination, or the sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or theater, or for signal or ceremonial purposes in athletics or sports, or for use by military organizations. Such wholesalers, dealers and jobbers shall store their supplies of fireworks in accordance with Section 505.060 of this Code.

SECTION 210.700: MANUFACTURE PROHIBITED -- COMPLIANCE

The manufacture of fireworks is prohibited within the City. The display, sale or discharge of fireworks shall comply with the requirements of this Article.

SECTION 210.710: SEIZURE OF FIREWORKS

The City may seize, take, remove or cause to be removed at the expense of the owner at the discretion of the Chief of Police, all stocks of fireworks offered or exposed for display or sale, stored or held in violation of this Article.

SECTION 210.720: PERMIT TO DISCHARGE

A. No person shall explode, discharge, ignite, light or make a display of any fireworks within the city without first obtaining either a Standard Fireworks Discharge Permit or a Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit as provided in this section.

B. Application for either a Standard Fireworks Discharge Permit or a Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit shall be made in writing at least seven (7) working days in advance of the date of the display or discharge of fireworks and shall be accompanied by an application fee of twenty-five dollars

(\$25.00). The sale, possession, use and distribution of fireworks for such display shall be lawful under the terms and conditions approved with the permit and for that purpose only. A permit granted hereunder shall not be transferable, nor shall any such permit be extended beyond the dates set out therein.

C. Applications for display of fireworks under the Standard Fireworks Discharge Permit shall be approved by the Chief of Police and issued by the City Clerk. Applicants must first obtain a permit from either the State Fire Marshal or the Osage Beach Fire Protection District and provide a copy of said permit with the application.

D. There is hereby created a Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit, to be approved by the Chief of Police and issued by the City Clerk under the following terms and conditions. The holder of a residential fireworks discharge permit is permitted to discharge consumer fireworks only on the premises of property owned by the permit holder under to following terms and conditions:

1. A Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit under this chapter shall apply only to "Consumer fireworks", explosive devices designed primarily to produce visible or audible effects by combustion and includes aerial devices and ground devices, all of which are classified as fireworks, UNO336, 1.4G by regulation of the United States Department of Transportation, as amended from time to time, and which were formerly classified as class C common fireworks by regulation of the United States Department of Transportation;

2. Fireworks shall be handled and discharged only by the permit holder.

3. Fireworks shall be discharged only between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on Memorial Day, July 2, 3, and 4, and Labor Day, and on December 31 from 11:30 p.m. to January 1 at 12:30 a.m. For noise created by a residential fireworks discharge the provisions of Section 220.020 shall not apply.

4. The permit holder shall at all time keep and display the permit to any law enforcement authority who requests to see it.

5. Each permit shall be issued for a specific date.

E. No residential fireworks permit shall be issued until the applicant has signed the application under the pains and penalties of perjury that they possess, in current full force and effect, insurance covering property damage from the use of the fireworks a minimum amount of one hundred thousand dollars, (\$100,000).

F. Upon issuance of a residential fireworks permit a copy thereof shall be transmitted to the fire protection service providing service in the area of the display.

SECTION 210.730: SALE AND DISCHARGE REGULATIONS

A. It shall be a violation of this Code for any person to store, to offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail, or use or explode any fireworks, except as provided in the rules and regulations issued by the City for the granting of a Residential Fireworks Display Permit or a Standard Fireworks Discharge Permit for supervised public displays of fireworks by the jurisdiction, fair associations, amusement parks and other organizations.

B. For any display not otherwise covered by residential display permit section 210.720 E above any such display shall be supervised by a person licensed and bonded for the purpose of discharging

fireworks. The fireworks shall be arranged, located, discharged or fired in a manner that, in the opinion of the Chief of Police, will not be a hazard to property or endanger any person.

SECTION 210.740: DISPOSAL OF UNFIRED FIREWORKS

Unfired fireworks and trash that remain after the display is concluded shall be immediately disposed of in a safe manner approved by the City.

SECTION 210.750: BOND FOR DISPLAY

An Applicant for a Standard Fireworks Discharge permit under this Article shall provide proof satisfactory to the City Attorney of financial ability to pay all damages which may be caused either to a person or persons or to property by reason of the permitted display arising from the acts of the permittee, the permittee's agent, employees, contractors or subcontractors. Proof of financial responsibility shall be satisfied by furnishing a bond or liability insurance policy covering any of the aforesaid damages in the amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and in such a form as determined by the City Attorney to be adequate in each case to indemnify the City.

Section 2. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 3. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon date of passage and approval by the Mayor.

ARTICLE XIV. FIREWORKS

SECTION 210.680: DEFINITION

In this Article "fireworks" means any composition or device for producing a visible, audible, or both visible and audible effect by combustion, deflagration, or detonation and that meets the definition of consumer, proximate, or display fireworks as set forth by 49 CFR Part 171 to end, United States Department of Transportation hazardous materials regulations, and American Pyrotechnics Association 87-1 standards.

SECTION 210.690: EXCEPTIONS

Nothing in this Article shall be construed to prohibit any resident wholesaler, dealer or jobber to sell at wholesale such fireworks as are not herein prohibited, or the sale of any kind of fireworks provided the same are to be shipped directly out of State, or the use of fireworks by railroads or other transportation agencies for signal purposes or illumination, or the sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or theater, or for signal or ceremonial purposes in athletics or sports, or for use by military organizations. Such wholesalers, dealers and jobbers shall store their supplies of fireworks in accordance with Section 505.060 of this Code.

SECTION 210.700: MANUFACTURE PROHIBITED -- COMPLIANCE

The manufacture of fireworks is prohibited within the City. The display, sale or discharge of fireworks shall comply with the requirements of this Article.

SECTION 210.710: SEIZURE OF FIREWORKS

The City may seize, take, remove or cause to be removed at the expense of the owner at the discretion of the Chief of Police, all stocks of fireworks offered or exposed for display or sale, stored or held in violation of this Article.

SECTION 210.720: PERMIT TO DISCHARGE

A. No person shall explode, discharge, ignite, light or make a display of any fireworks within the city without first obtaining either a Standard Fireworks Discharge Permit or a Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit as provided in this section.

Deleted: A. A permit shall be obtained from the City for the discharge of fireworks.¶

B. Application for either a Standard Fireworks Discharge Permit or a Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit shall be made in writing at least seven (7) working days in advance of the date of the display or discharge of fireworks and shall be accompanied by an application fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The sale, possession, use and distribution of fireworks for such display shall be lawful under the terms and conditions approved with the permit and for that purpose only. A permit granted hereunder shall not be transferable, nor shall any such permit be extended beyond the dates set out therein.

C. Applications for display of fireworks under the Standard Fireworks Discharge Permit shall be approved by the Chief of Police and issued by the City Clerk. Applicants must first obtain a permit from either the State Fire Marshal or the Osage Beach Fire Protection District and provide a copy of said permit with the application.

The following D - F is newly added language:

D. There is hereby created a Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit, to be issued by the Chief of Police under the following terms and conditions. The holder of a residential fireworks discharge permit is permitted to discharge consumer fireworks only on the premises of property owned by the permit holder under to following terms and conditions:

1. A Residential Fireworks Discharge Permit under this chapter shall apply only to "Consumer fireworks", explosive devices designed primarily to produce visible or audible effects by combustion and includes aerial devices and ground devices, all of which are classified as fireworks, UN0336, 1.4G by regulation of the United States Department of Transportation, as amended from time to time, and which were formerly classified as class C common fireworks by regulation of the United States Department of Transportation;

2. Fireworks shall be handled and discharged only by the permit holder.

3. Fireworks shall be discharged only between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on Memorial Day July 2, 3, and 4, Labor Day, and December 31 from 11:30 p.m. to January 1 at 12:30 a.m. For noise created by a residential fireworks discharge the provisions of Section 220.020 shall not apply.

4. The permit holder shall at all time keep and display the permit to any law enforcement authority who requests to see it.

5. Each permit shall be issued for a specific date.
