Department Comments and Recommendation:

This is a Osage Beach Special Road District Project to reconstruct Dorothy Lane off of Sunset Drive. We opened bids on March 26, 2019. There were 3 bidders. Stockman Construction was the low bidder with a bid amount of \$50,581.

The Osage Beach Special Road District is funding this project at 100%. The Osage Beach Special Road District met on March 27, 2019, and they are good with proceeding.

We have done work with Stockman Construction in the past with good results. They are the contractor that worked on Nichols Road between Osage Beach Parkway and Highway 54.

The Public Works Department recommends approval of this ordinance.

City Administrator Comments and Recommendation:

The first reading was read and passed by the Board of Aldermen on April 18, 2019.

Per City Code 110.230, Bill 19-21 is in correct form as per City Attorney.

In 2017, the Board of Aldermen approved the department to use staff time to complete the design of the project due to the approval by the OBSRD to fund the project.

This is a FY2019 budgeted project and I concur with the Public Works Director's recommendation.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE CONTRACT OB19-006 WITH STOCKMAN CONSTRUCTION FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF DOROTHY LANE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS, WIT:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Board of Aldermen hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute on behalf of the City Construction Contract OB19-006 with Stockman Construction for the reconstruction of Dorothy Lane, under substantially the same terms as set forth in the draft contract attached hereto as ("Exhibit A").

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING SECTION 325.060 RELATING TO TRAVELING THROUGH ROUNDABOUTS AND DESIGNATING ROUNDABOUTS BY ADDING A NEW DESIGNATION TO SUBSECTION F.

Whereas, the Board of Aldermen finds that public safety requires an ordinance to govern traffic movement at the new traffic roundabout intersections.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS, WIT.

<u>Section 1</u>. Amending Section 325.060 of Chapter 325 Title III the Traffic Code of the City of Osage Beach Code of Ordinances is hereby enacted to read as follows:

Section 325.060. Roundabout Islands and Intersections.

- A. No person shall drive past a roundabout island except to the right of such island.
- B. Every vehicle, upon approaching a roundabout, shall yield to vehicles within, or partially within, the roundabout
- C. Drivers entering or leaving a roundabout are excused from the signaling requirements of Section 340.190.
- D. No driver of a vehicle shall overtake or pass or attempt to overtake or pass any other vehicle proceeding in the same direction within a single lane roundabout.
- E. No vehicle shall park, stop, or stand in a roundabout at any time
- F. The following intersections are designated as Roundabouts:
 - 1. State Highway KK and Burton Duenke Lane
 - 2. Passover Road at Wilson Drive, Wyrick Drive and Mill Lane
 - 3. Nichols Road at Hospital Drive.

4. Mace Road

Section 2. Severability

The chapter, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 3. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the date of passage and approval by the Mayor.

Department Comments and Recommendation:

A request for proposals was sent out for a GIS based asset management software. This software will replace the current software that Public Works uses for Work Orders. It was requested an easy to use, mobile friendly software that is highly compatible with our existing GIS system and hardware. The software has to have an inventory component, a fleet management component and work order component.

6 vendors submitted proposals. (Tyler Tech., Elements, Mears, HiperWeb, PubWorks, Lucity). We requested all 6 vendors to do a presentation and representatives from IT and Public Works were involved with the presentations. It was the consensus of the group that PubWorks was the best solution for the City.

PubWorks was contacted and asked if they would provide the Public Works Department the opportunity to demo the product. They provided us a link to their software. PubWorks sent their Customer Support manager to train a Public Works employee to use the software. The employee tested the software from start to finish for work orders. The employee found the software very user friendly, and very robust. It was also evaluated on analyzing data once work orders are completed. This software will provide Public Works with a robust platform for Asset Management. Also to note, this software has the ability to allow customers to submit a service request through the web. We anticipate utilizing this 6 months after implementation to get accustomed to the software. The City of Lake Ozark utilizes portions of this software and gave us great reviews.

The first year cost for this software is \$28,220 which includes License Cost, installation, training and annual support, and cloud hosting. The cost after year one will be an annual maintenance and cloud hosting \$4,070, which PubWorks has agreed to hold through the 3rd year of service.

The budgeted amount is \$60,000. The budgeted amount was based upon preliminary discussion with several different vendors and it felt appropriate to budget that amount due to variability issues. The program cost is split between the Transportation, Water, and Sewer Funds, and will be coded as follows:

This is a Osage Beach Special Road District Project to reconstruct Rowan Road. We opened bids on April 18, 2019. There were 3 bidders. Higgins Asphalt Paving Company Inc. was the low bidder with a bid amount of \$54,718.54.

The Osage Beach Special Road District is funding this project at 100%.

We have done work with Higgins Asphalt Paving Company Inc. in the past with good results. They are the contractor that worked on Creek Cove Lane in 2017.

The Public Works Department recommends approval of this bill.

Department Comments and Recommendation:

This is for the purchase of salt for deicing of the road ways. The apparent low bidder is Central Salt in the amount of \$82.21/ton with a total of 450 tons bid resulting in a total bid amount of \$36,994.50. The 450 ton will replenish the salt used in 2018/2019 winter.

This item was not brought to you last year since our bid pricing and quantities were lower. We believe the low bidder made a mistake last year, but they honored their bid. Last year's pricing was \$54.18/ton.

The last two years we have been trying to reduce our costs by advertising with other governmental entities. The 2017 price for salt was \$80.25/ton and the 2016 price for salt was \$86.89/ton prior to cooperative bidding. We believe we have been effective in getting better prices by bidding with others. When we talked with bidders this year, we believed pricing was going to be high because of the massive amount of snow fall that happened in the Midwest this year. We felt the cooperative bidding helped keep the prices low.

We are over budget because we used approximately 150 tons more than we budgeted for. We only budgeted for 300 tons. A budget amendment will be completed for this if this is approved.

The Public Works Department recommends the award be made to Central Salt in the amount of \$36,994.50.

City Administrator Comments and Recommendation:

FY2019 Budget was \$30,000, request to purchase is \$36,994.50. Funds to cover the overage in budget is being recommended to come from line item 20-00-761300 Road Repair & Maintenance. The first reading of the budget amendment, bill 19.34, for this requested is on the May 2, 2019 agenda (this agenda).

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City Administrator Comments and Recommendation:

RSMo Chapter 145.049 established the Back to School Sales Tax Holiday. In 2006 the Osage Beach Board of Aldermen enacted an ordinance opting out of the holiday and per Chapter 145.049.(3).6., the ordinance prohibited future sales tax holidays from applying to the local sales tax.

Last year I was asked to bring this topic before the Board to discuss prior to any MoDOR deadlines for the 2019 Back to School Sales Tax Holiday in case the current Board wishes to make changes to our current ordinance.

If the Board chooses to participate in the Back to School Sales Tax Holiday, the current ordinance can be rescinded; a bill will be drafted and brought before the Board on the next agenda (May 16, 2019).

An adopted change does required notification to the Missouri Department of Revenue must be made no less than 45 calendar days prior to the beginning date of the upcoming sales tax holiday in which the change will apply. The upcoming Back to School Sales Tax Holiday start August 2, 2019; therefore, any ordinance changes would need to be completed and notification made no later than June 17, 2019.
