Financial Update

Financial Statements/Budget

Reconciliation September 30, 2021
Financial Statements are unaudited, data shows we expended 56.3% of our \$33.8 million FY2021 Operating Budget and collected 69.0% of budgeted revenues for all funds.

FY2020 Financial Statement Audit - The City received an unqualified, or clean, opinion, stating that the FY2020 Annual Financial Statements were presented fairly in all material aspects.

Sales Tax Revenue Report:

Sales tax revenue represents a large portion of the City's revenue source, 48% projected in the FY2021 overall budget. Fees & Service Charges represent 30% of projected revenue in the FY2021 overall budget. Although used for only on-time expenditures, Grants & Reimbursements represent 17% of incoming revenues in FY2021; Other Income representing 5%.

October 2021 Sales Tax receipts are \$818,242 (20.0%) more than FY2020 receipts for the same period and \$757,320 (18.2%) more that projected in the FY2021 Budget. Historically, the last six months of the year (July - December) we have collected 58%-60% of our annual sales tax during that time. Top three collection months historically is - September, 2nd July, and 3rd October. Calculating in recent collections, I estimated sales tax collection for FY2021 at 16% - 19% over previous year collections.

The local sales tax receipts received from the State of Missouri for the month we indicate as October 2021 represents sales made by consumers in August 2021. Local sales tax is received by the State in the second month following purchases made by consumers. The sales tax receipts listed on the report represent the 1% general fund local sales tax received.

The City imposes a 2% sales tax on goods and services sold within the City limits. 1% is collected in the General Fund, 0.5% is collected in the Capital Improvement Tax (CIT) Fund, and 0.5% is collected in the Transportation Fund.

2021 ARPA Update - State and Local Recovery Funds

The City Treasurer's Office received the first half of funds, \$470,765.74, last month, with the second half to be received no earlier than twelve months after first payment. A strategic discussion to outline expenditures will take place after the first of year.

Some good news as staff makes our way through all the requirements and objectives of the program, the required annual reporting has been amended by the U.S. Department of Treasury for NEU's (non-entitlement units) with the first report due April 30, 2022! Originally the date was October 31, 2021. Funds can cover eligible costs *incurred* between March 3, 2021 and December 31, 2024, and must be expended by December 31, 2026.

Use of Funds can be found [HERE](#), and include the following:

- **Support public health expenditures**, by, for example, funding COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff,
- **Address negative economic impacts** caused by the public health emergency, including economic harms to workers, households, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector,
- **Replace lost public sector revenue**, using this funding to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic,
- **Provide premium pay for essential workers**, offering additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors,
- **Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure**, making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, and to expand access to broadband internet.

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE

- **Projects:**
 - *Autumn Lane* - Design in underway as well as work on ROW documents. Plans are expected to be presented to the Board of Aldermen in November.
 - *Mace Rd Ph 2b* - Construction is ongoing; completion expected mid-November 2021.
 - *OB Parkway Extension to Executive Drive* - Preliminary engineering and design has begun. This is a MoDOT and OBSRD funded partnership project. Per Cost-Share approved scheduled, construction must be completed no later than July 2023.
